




The Fellowship's theme is "board games," opening many fellowship opportunities within Chapters and with lodge members. I cannot wait to see all of you there!

- Be an integral part of Scouting America and encourage participation in all it offers through units, outdoor adventures, and national events to further the Scouting experience.

The underlying theme throughout each of these expressions of principle is that our Order is the premier membership retention arm of Scouting America. For those of us who have been longtime members of the OA, this will come as no surprise. Many of us would agree that the Order of the Arrow is what has kept us involved in Scouting all along. For those who are newer to the Order, I suspect you will also come to appreciate how the lodge is different and unique, as we strive to provide quality experiences that will help keep you engaged for years to come.

Regardless of tenure, it is now our collective responsibility to give greater focus to this fundamental duty: to grow the Order and deliver the promise of Scouting to more and more young people, preserving our program and spreading it to others.
